

Editorial:

Fluctuat NEC mergitur. The famous motto of the City of Paris applies to the current situation of the French Stereo Club: it is shaken but not sinking. We were informed a few days ago that rooms which the Lorem, a partnering association, dedicated to us are no longer available. We can no longer hold our weekly meetings there and we have had to urgently move out our equipment, library and archives. The managing board is looking for new premises, which rent we can afford. This is not an easy task in Paris. In addition, sanitary conditions limit the possibilities of physical meetings.

We held our annual General Meeting according to the normal rules, thanks to Thierry Mercier, Patrice Cadot and Pierre Meindre who fulfilled the functions of meeting secretary and scrutineers. Due to current sanitary conditions, the number of members who were physically present was largely offset by those who voted by mail. I thank the members who unanimously discharged the chairman and approved the moral report. The General Assembly also, by a very large majority, approved the financial report, the provisional budget, the € 10 membership fee for persons under 25 and reelected Jean-Yves Gresser and Michel Mikloweit as managing board members.

The later met by videoconference and elected the new executive board with Jean-Yves Gresser as vice-chairman, Thierry Mercier as secretary, Patrice Cadot as treasurer and myself as chairman. I thank the first three for their dedication to the Club. This board will have to deal urgently with two important tasks: finding new premises and safeguarding our activities despite the current sanitary conditions.

The uncertainties in both areas motivate us to do more with videoconferencing, thus enabling the Stereo Club to be active regardless of the current environment.
